### Town of Nahant, MA Board of Selectmen

## Meeting Minutes Wednesday June 13, 2018 6:00 PM

Chesley R. Taylor Jr., Chairman Richard J. Lombard, Vice Chairman Frank Barile, Recording Secretary Gerry Perry, Acting Town Administrator

#### 1. Meeting Opening 6:00 pm

Pledge of Allegiance - Led by Mr. Taylor who turned the meeting over to Mr. Barile for **Recognition of Peter Rogers.** Mr. Barile praised Mr. Rogers and listed his many contributions to the town: his involvement with Periwinkle Preschool, TA Act, town meetings, and serving on countless committees.

Mr. Rogers said he was surprised and moved by the tribute and the large audience who was present for his reception. He stressed town involvement and taking a stand while treating your opponents with respect. He received a standing ovation. The Board presented him with a certificate of appreciation. Senator Crighton presented a citation for recognition of his years of work for the town, state and United States. Meeting was recessed at 6:18PM for a reception for Mr. Rogers.

#### Meeting reopened at 7:00

- **a. Opening Comments:** Mr. Taylor said he attended a ceremony for retiring Captain Claudia Geltzer at Johnson School. He also expressed sympathy to the Belliveau family on Mrs. Belliveau's death.
- **b.** Approve minutes of 5/17/18 Mr. Barile made a motion to approve the minutes of 5/17/18. Mr. Lombard seconded for discussion. Mr. Lombard wants a better understanding of the Ellingwood Chapel Grant and fears historical restrictions required by the grant will give the state control. Mr. Barile made a motion to approve the minutes but strike Section C Cemetery easement from the minutes. Mr. Lombard seconded the motion. Unanimous vote to approve amended minutes.

Mr. Perry then explained that Community Preservation Committee (CPC) sponsored state grant that was approved at town meeting requires a preservation restriction on the area around the chapel. This is a distinct parcel that excludes the rest of the cemetery. The grant application has been submitted but the town hasn't heard yet if awarded. Mr. Lombard then made a motion not to accept the grant. Mr. Barile seconded for discussion. Ms. Lynne Spencer, Chair of CPC committee and historical commission member said there are existing preservation restrictions on a number of buildings; town hall, library, community center and life-saving station. The preservation restriction affects only those elements of the building that make it historical. A CPC architectural assessment revealed significant repairs needed for the chapel and wall. The grant addresses the chapel only. It is not an easement but a restriction.

Mr. Perry recommended that the Board wait to see if the grant is awarded. He will present the grant, the restrictions required, and the architectural assessment so the Board can make an informed decision - and then vote. Ms. Spencer wants to go on the record that the restriction does not involve any subterranean construction (movement of graves). Mr. Taylor called the vote to not accept the grant. Mr. Lombard voted to not accept the grant. Mr. Barile voted to not accept the grant. Mr. Taylor voted yes to wait.

#### 2. New Business -

a. Public Library - Short Beach Box - Sharon Hawkes, Library Director presented a project from "Little Free Library" which is a book hutch on the path to Short Beach with books for users to give and take from Memorial to Labor Day. The Friends of Library will pay for it and the library will stock and maintain the hutch. Mr. Taylor requested she check with Conservation Commission about the location. Mr. Lombard made a motion to approve the hutch. Mr. Barile seconded the motion. Unanimous vote in favor of installation.

#### 3. Ongoing Business

a. Citizen's Forum - Ms. Jen McCarthy, 19 Range Road asked for a wharf ramp update as her husband's boat was damaged at low tide by the ramp. Mr. Perry stated that a punch list for the wharf has been presented to the contractor, Unified through both parties' lawyers and is in negotiation. Final payment has been withheld. Discussion about remedies, additional work needed, a need for a marine engineer and improved communication. Mr. Perry replied that Childs Engineering was engaged to manage the project and the process was in litigation. Further discussion could jeopardize the town's position and belongs in executive session.

### 4. Town Administrator Report

- **a. FY19 Fee Schedule** for review only Mr. Perry said the only fees going up were water and sewer because of reduced consumption. Mr. Barile made a motion to approve the fee schedule as attached. Mr. Lombard seconded the motion. Unanimous vote.
- **b. FY19 Appointments** for review and vote. Mr. Barile made a motion to approve the appointments as attached. Mr. Lombard seconded the motion. Unanimous vote.
- c. Declare DPW Vehicle Lift Surplus Mr. Barile made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to declare surplus DPW 2004 vehicle lift Model PS012-13. Serial #0402-FNKMB-002 Mr. Lombard seconded the motion. Unanimous vote.
- **d.** Appoint Matthew Videtta Call Firefighter Mr. Barile made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve Matthew Videtta Call Fire Fighter upon the recommendation of Chief Feinberg. Mr. Lombard seconded the motion. Unanimous vote.
- **e.** Call Firefighter Pay Scale Approve Mr. Barile made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve the call firefighter pay scale as presented by Chief Feinberg Mr. Lombard seconded the motion. Unanimous vote.
- **f.** Approve event request Womens Club Holiday Fair 11-24-18 9-3 Town Hall Mr. Barile made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve the event request for the Womens Club Holiday Fair 11-24-18 from 9AM to 3PM Town Hall. Mr. Lombard seconded the motion. Unanimous vote.
- **g.** Approve one day liquor license NVA Flag Retirement Ceremony June 15 NLSS Mr. Barile made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve the one day all alcohol liquor license for the NVA flag retirement ceremony 6/15/18 at NLSS. Mr. Lombard seconded the motion. Unanimous vote
- h. Approve Library Family Concert 8-1-18 7:00 PM Town Hall Mr. Barile made a motion that the Board of Selectmen vote to approve the concert 8-1-18 at 7:00 PM Town Hall. Mr. Lombard seconded the motion. Unanimous vote
- i. Update on Activities Mr. Perry gave the following updates:
  - Tudor Beach Bids for emergency engineering work are due tomorrow and will begin procurement for work needed shortly
  - Summer DPW Crew 4 students working and 2 more will begin 7/1/18

- Ant Bikes Spoke with president of the company who promised removal of the bikes within 24 hours of being left in Town. If not removed, they will be removed by the DPW and locked up per police bylaw.
- Compost Area Cameras repaired
- Golf Course Irrigation Line Electric line replaced
- Coast Guard Housing Committee Town has contracted with Hancock Co for surveying work at the request of the CGH Design Committee.
- Mutual Aid Dispatch Contract with Lynn is being reviewed by Town Counsel and will be signed shortly.
- Fort Ruckman DEP is in process of resolution testing done nothing major found Envirotrac on final stage to close out with DEP.
- **j.** Summer BOS meeting schedule Mr. Perry reported that on 6-27, the TA Search Committee will make their final recommendation of candidates. 7/7/18 Saturday, each BOS member will interview each candidate separately. Wed 7/11 BOS will interview the finalists in open session and vote. Background check will be done and then contract signed on 8/8 with a start date after Labor Day.

Ms. Jen McCarthy of the TA committee is concerned about the timeline between the TA Committee interviews and the final selection. She feels they may lose candidates. Mr. Perry acknowledges the need for expediency but with summer vacation schedules, this is the best they could do. The Board wants Attorney Chris Drucas to draw up the contact.

- **5. Old Business -** Mr. Barile said that a state Municipal Vulnerability Planning (MVP) Grant of \$15,000 awarded to the Town. MVP committee will use the funds to hire a planner to assess the vulnerability of the Town, draw up an action plan and be eligible for more funding.

- 7. Adjourn Mr. Barile made a motion to adjourn at 9:00 PM. Mr. Lombard seconded the motion. Unanimous vote to adjourn.

# From Town Charter:

Article 3, section 3-4(d) Licensing authority: The Board of Selectmen shall be the license board of the Town and shall have the power to issue licenses, to make all necessary rules and regulations regarding the issuance of such licenses and to attach conditions and impose restrictions thereto as it deems to be in the public interest, and to enforce the laws relating to all business for which it issues licenses.
